Montréal, Wednesday, November 14, 2007 — The MONTREAL HIGH LIGHTS Festival presents its Sun Life Financial Performing Arts program, putting the spotlight on culture and the arts! From Thursday, February 21 to Sunday, March 2, 2008, the 9th edition of the urban winter event offers up a program that may just melt away a Montréal winter! Featuring performances by international and local artists, surprising shows, original creations, major premières and must-see events, there's something to satisfy every taste and passion! Tickets for shows in the Sun Life Financial Performing Arts program go on sale Saturday, November 17, 2007, at noon. And while you're soaking up all that cultural sustenance, remember that the MONTREAL HIGH LIGHTS Festival also serves up the Air France Wine & Dine Experience presented by American Express (unveiling its program on December 12), the wildness of the Montreal All-Nighter, the always festive Celebration of Light and the sportive and social Montreal Downtown & Underground Event (respective programs to be unveiled in early 2008).

**Margie Gillis and Eva Yerbabuena,
honorary co-presidents of the Sun Life Financial Performing Arts**

This year again, two very big-name artists will be serving as honorary co-presidents of the Festival's performing arts segment: Montreal's Margie Gillis, one of the major figures in contemporary dance, and the European flamenco star Eva Yerbabuena.

Eva Yerbabuena Ballet Flamenco, *Santo y Señá* — opening concert

Born in Frankfurt in 1970, she was on the move two weeks later when her parents moved back to their native Granada. And movement—the flamenco—became her raison d'être. After studying under the masters, Mario Maya and Raphael Aguilar, she quickly became one of the style's most brilliant dancers, developing her own style to the extent that she is credited as the only performer capable of reaching the true giddy heights of the form. It's a style rich in emotion, purity, character authenticity and sensuality. With the moving performance from her most recent show, *Santo y Señá*, this major European flamenco star, Eva Yerbabuena, presents her company—12 dancers and musicians—and its unique language and signs that have set it apart with remarkable choreographies presented over the last decade. Margie Gillis, *M.Body.7* / *M.Corps.7*— World première

It's a world première dance performance, from the honorary co-president of the MONTREAL HIGH LIGHTS artistic program, who also happens to be one of the most celebrated figures on the international contemporary dance scene. In short, three events in one! Renowned for her alluring personality, her style and her incomparable virtuosity, as well as her deeply intuitive rendering of the infinite facets of the human soul, the choreographer has given close to four decades of service to her art. To celebrate her 35th season of excellence, she opens with the *M.Body.7* program; then, solo or accompanied by an all-female troupe (*Gioconda Barbuto, Anik Bissonnette, Holly Bright, Laurence Lemieux, Emily Molnar and Risa Steinberg*), she performs *M.Corps.7*. Sibylline titles that prophesize an evening of surprises! Friday, February 29, at Théâtre Maisonneuve, PDA.

The return of Michel Fugain!

Closing the event, we herald the return of the great Michel Fugain, back in Quebec after a ten-year absence to share his greatest hits with us! This icon of French song—more of a showman than ever at age 65—brings his

magnificent voice, the legacy of his massive Big Bazar band, and a timeless songbook featuring a few new chapters. *Je n'aurai pas le temps, Fais comme l'oiseau, Une belle histoire, La fête, Bravo, Monsieur le Monde, Viva la vida...* Songs that haven't aged a day, as contemporary as breaking news... and dressed up to party! HOUDINI, the Musical

The Spaghetti Western Orchestra

After their enormous success during last summer's Festival International de Jazz de Montréal, **The Spaghetti Western Orchestra** brings its theatrical musical concept back to Théâtre Outremont! Relive your memories of Sergio Leone's iconic Italian westerns as these Aussie multi-instrumentalists ingeniously recreate scenes from the Italian westerns that changed an American film genre, recreating—down to the smallest sonic details—immortal scenes from *Once Upon a Time in the West, For a Few Dollars More, The Good, the Bad and the Ugly*, and more. In an evocative setting, the show, both comic and dramatic, stands as a veritable tribute to the greatest of film-score composers, Ennio Morricone, finally singled out for an Honorary Lifetime Achievement Award at the Oscars. Relative Good

A Canadian citizen of Middle Eastern origin lands at JFK airport in New York, in a post-9-11 America where rights have become terrifyingly, arbitrarily flexible, or even invisible. ***Relative Good***, the new play written and directed by Montrealer David Gow, brings ironic, disturbing and very Kafkaesque issues torn from current headlines to the fore, limning our fears and anxieties and the human cost incurred when we judge a man by his name, birthplace or background. **From Tuesday, February 26 to Sunday, March 2, Centaur Theatre.**

Julia Migenes

Montréal, prepare yourself for the diva in full force! Accompanied solely by pianist Édouard Ferlet, New York soprano **Julia Migenes** will soar through a varied and refreshing repertoire: from Céline Dion to Jacques Brel, from Gershwin to Leonard Cohen, all their songs pass through the prism of her talent, revealing different facets of a singer with a personality as flamboyant as her hair! **Thursday, February 21, Théâtre Maisonneuve, PDA. Chris Botti

For one unique evening, she treats us to the many facets of her dizzying talent in a brand new show: Gainsbourg, of course, as well as other songwriters such as Cali, Arthur H, Dominique A and Rufus Wainwright who've written for her, and songwriters—Kate Bush, Tom Waits and even Neil Young – whose work we might previously have considered untouchable. Aline de Lima

She started out writing her songs—her poems set to music—in concealment; but she couldn't hide this light under a bushel for very long! Beautiful, luminous, joyous and blessed with a voice of surpassing warmth, **Aline de Lima** brings a welcome ray of South American sunshine to our February! Her album *Arrebol*, on Naïve, takes deep inspiration from her Brazilian roots, peppering her saudades with charming, danceable little frevos. **Saturday, February 23, Club Soda.**

Bobby McFerrin & Voicestra

A universally recognized jazz pioneer in a cappella, **Bobby McFerrin** slapped a smile on the planet in the '80s with his irresistible Don't Worry, Be Happy. With his **Voicestra** vocal ensemble, he takes the listener on a musical voyage as far as the aural horizon, from jazz to blues-rock with byways through Indian classical opera, with improvisation as their guiding principle. Claudia Acuña

Chile, Featured Country

Chilean singer, songwriter and arranger **Claudia Acuña** has a sensibility, authenticity, and undeniably human warmth that adorn her voice with elegance. Whether showcasing her effortless mastery of jazz technique or plumbing the Latin rhythms of her roots, she's one of those artists who bring emotion to everything she sings. Hawksley Workman (opening act: Sebastien Grainger)

Classical music

Les Violons du Roy, *L'expérience Bartok*

Les Violons du Roy—29 musicians under the direction of Jean-Marie Zeitouni—present *L'expérience Bartók*, an extraordinary program magisterially blending colour, contrast and the most expressive of musics. Experience major works for chamber orchestra, drawn from the Hungarian pianist-composer's repertoire. Along with the music of Béla Bartók, we'll also experience the contemporary minimalist compositions of Estonia's Arvo Pärt. **Saturday, February 23, Salle Pierre-Mercure.**

L'Ensemble Caprice, *Vivaldi et les gitans*

Autour de la flûte presents *Le Siècle des Lumières de Paris à Berlin*

A delightful voyage through time and space with baroque/romantic ensemble **Autour de la flûte** and the musical magic woven from its period instruments! With renowned baroque flautist Mika Putterman leading the way on the wooden instrument that was all the rage from the 17th to 19th century in Europe, the group transports us to the heart of the ***Siècle des Lumières de Paris à Berlin***. **Thursday, February 21, Notre-Dame-de-Bon-Secours Chapel.**

The Path to Paradise

Peggy Baker Dance Projects: *Portal* — world première

A major name on the international dance scene, Toronto's Peggy Baker has a special gift for Montréal! With music from pianist Andrew Burashko, violinist Olivier Thouin and cellist Yegor Dyachkov, she and her company open the program with *Unfold*, interpreted by Andrea Nann, followed by two world premières: Baker's most recent solo, *Portal*, performed in silence, and a pas de deux with Larry Hahn, *A Woman By A Man*, created by renowned choreographer James Kudelka. Four evenings of uncommon grace. **From Wednesday, February 20 to Saturday, February 23, in the Cinquième Salle, PdA!**

FLAMENCOntemporain

Three remarkable choreographers offer a very contemporary vision of the flamenco. Rae Bowhay's *Llama Da* and Sylvie Marchand's *Rouge Solitude* are joined by a completely new work from Myriam Allard and Hedi El Moro Graja.
